

DEAR RESIDENT,



1080 baiting is currently underway in your area.

1080 poison is cruel and indiscriminate. It can kill your pets as well as native animals. It is also toxic to the ecosystem.

The 1080 baits on neighbouring properties can also be transported to your property by birds or other animals who dig them up and drop them.

There is no known antidote. Once ingested, your pet could suffer in agony for a prolonged period before they die.

1080 baiting is used as part of the 'wild dog and fox program'. There is real concern about the continued use of this toxic poison - which is included in the same class as other notorious chemicals like arsenic and cyanide - in an already compromised ecosystem.

In March 2021, the Blue Mountains City Council unanimously voted to support banning the use of 1080 poison.

Unfortunately, local government has no control over the use of 1080 baits on land owned or operated by the state government or its agencies. This includes National Parks, reserves and private properties.

1080 poison should be banned as there are humane alternatives available. These include guardian animals, such as alpacas, donkeys, and Maremma dogs, as well as allowing dingoes to fulfil their natural role in Australia's ecosystems.
